**L** E T T E R S from Vienna of the 10th Instant advise, that the Prince of Saxe Hildbourghaufen was arrived there from Tyrol, in order to confer and settle with the Imperial Ministers, sufficient Means for supplying with Provisions the Imperial Army when it shall be ready to march back into Italy: Till which Time Quarters were appointed in Austria for six of the Regiments of Horse of that Army now in Tyrol; and they will be distributed into such Posts, as that they may soon draw together upon the first Order. We have Accounts from Germany, that the first Division of the Russian Troops, which the Czarina has sent to assist the Emperor, having been joined by four Regiments of Horse that Prince Eugene had detached from his Army to meet them, had passed by Nuremberg the 14th Instant, on their Way to the Camp marked out for them near Heidelberg, and that they had kept strict Discipline throughout their March, giving no Manner of Occasion of Complaint. The Armies on each Side the Rhine continue to observe each other.
