Stockholm, August 5.

THIS Morning a Renewal of the Defensive Alliance between Sweden and Muscovy, was signed by M. Bestuchef, the Czarina's Minister here, and the Swedish Commissioners.

Bologna, Aug. 2. The Imperial Forces in the Tirol, having been considerably reinforced from Germany, and most of their Sick recovering, it is thought they will shortly be in a Condition to appear in the Field.

Bologna, Aug. 9. On the 3d, the King of Sardinia (after having visited the Borders of the Oglio, Adda, and the Lago di Lecco, and reviewed his Garrisons in the Milanese) arrived at Cremona on his Return to his Head Quarters at Bozolo. On the 4th, the Marshal de Noailles arrived at Milan from his Tour to Bergamo and Como, after having been to visit that Lake and the Fort de Fuentes, as also the Roads that lead to the Valteline, in order to view the Passages by which Count Konigsegg may attempt to enter the Milanese.

Hanover, Aug. 23, N. S. On Thursday Night last there was a Ball and a Masquerade in Herenhausen Gardens; the Theatre in the Gardens was illuminated in an extraordinary Manner on this Occasion; the Ball was opened between Eight and Nine in the Evening, and lasted till Three in the Morning; the Chief of the Nobility and Gentry both in Court and Town, appeared there in Masks, and consisted of about Five hundred Persons, who were entertained in a very elegant Manner with all Sorts of Refreshments and a Supper. On Sunday Night about Six in the Evening, his Highness Prince William, Stadholder of the Landgraviate of Hesse Cassel, arrived here, and immediately waited on the King at Herenhausen. His Highness is lodged in a House which is always kept ready for the Reception of Foreign Princes, and attended by his Majesty's Servants.

Hanover, Aug. 27, N. S. On Wednesday Morning last Count Montijo, the Ambassador from Spain to the King of Great Britain, arrived here from Paris, and in the Afternoon he went to Herenhausen, and was introduced to his Majesty in the Orangerie of the Gardens there, by the Great Chamberlain the Marquess de la Forest.
