Hanover, Aug. 23, N. S. On Thursday Night last there was a Ball and a Masquerade in Herenhausen Gardens; the Theatre in the Gardens was illuminated in an extraordinary Manner on this Occasion; the Ball was opened between Eight and Nine in the Evening, and lasted till Three in the Morning; the Chief of the Nobility and Gentry both in Court and Town, appeared there in Masks, and confifted of about Five hundred Persons, who were entertained in a very elegant Manner with all Sorts of Refreshments and a Supper. On Sunday Night about Six in the Evening, his Highness Prince William, Stadholder of the Landgraviate of Heile Cailel, arrived here, and immediately waited on the King at Herenhausen. His Highness is lodg-ed in a House which is always kept ready for the Reception of Foreign Princes, and at-

tended by his Majesty's Servants.
