N the 3d Inftant M. Diepenbroek, Grand Veneur to the Printe of Naffau Dillenbourg, was admitted to an Audience of the King, and delivered a Letter to his Majesty on the Part of his Highness. On the 5th M. d'Aylva, Mafter of the Horfe to his most Serene Highness the Prince of Orange, arrived here, and was introduced to an Audienee of the King the fame Evening, when he delivered a Letter to his Majesty from his Highnels. The fame Evening the Marquels de la Forest, Grand Chamberlain to his Majefty, returned from Celle, whither he went on Saturday laft to fettle his private Affairs. The fame Day the Prince of Anhalt Zerbft arrived here, and in the Evening paid his Respects to the King at Herenhaufen. On the 6th Inftant at Noon M. de Imhoff, who has refided here for fome Time in Quality of Minister from Brunswick, deliver'd to the King a Letter from the Dutcheis Dowager of Walforbuttel marifements. Wolfenbuttel, notifying the Death of the late Duke her Confort, who died fudden-ly the 3d Inftant; upon which Occasion this Court goes this Day into Mourning for a Fortnight; he had afterwards his Audience of Leave of his Majefty, and fet out that Evening on his Return for Brunfwick. On the 7th the King was pleafed to promote the Landroft Steinberg to the Office of one of his Minifters of State, and named Six Coun-fellors of the Courts of Juffice, viz. M. Bothmer, de Haacken, and de Hardenberg, for Hanover; and M. Sheiter, Laffert and Ebel, for Celle; and his Majefty was also pleased to conftitute M. Finckstein Assessment Stade, and M. Behren Affeffor at Celle. M. Alt, Secretary from the King of Sweden, as Landgrave of Helle Callel, to the Court of Great Britain, took his Leave Yesterday of his Ma-jesty at Herenhausen, and set out this jefty at Herenhausen, and Morning from hence for Cassel.
