N the 10th Instant M. Gronau, Minister from the present Duke of Wolfenbuttel, came hither, and brought Advice, that his most Serene Highnels the Duke his Mafter arrived at Brunlwick from the Army on the Rhine on Thurfday the 8th. On the 11th the faid Minister had his Audience of the King, and prefented to his Majesty a Letter from the Duke his Mafter, notifying the Death of the late Duke his Father, and his Acceffion to that Dukedom. On the 14th the faid Minister took his Audience of Leave of his Majesty, and set out the next Morning on his Return to Brunfwick.

Paris, Sept. 17, N. S. Letters from Caftiglion del Stivere of the 5th Inftant advife, that on the 3d the Marshal de Noailles went to the King of Sardinia at Bardolano, to give him an Account of the Orders he had judged neceffary to iffue for the Troops of the Al-lies to advance to the Adige, and polfels themfelves of feveral Pofts on that River. The Imperialifts in Tyrol feeming by their Preparations and Motions to defign to march back into Italy, as foon as Count Koniglegg fhall return from Vienna, the King of Sardinia and the Marshal de Noailles had determined to be near at Hand to oppose that Design; accordingly most of the Troops of the Allies held themfelves in Readinefs to march, and those which were cantoned at the greatest Diftance wale to receive their Orders on the 6th; in the mean time the Marquess de Maillebois, with the Body he commands, march-

actually on the 5th, was to reach Maringo

the next Day, and from thence was to ad-vance with feveral Detachments that were to join him in his March to Gullolingo, while other Forces fecured divers Posts which the Enemy might otherwife feize. The Armies on the Rhine have not yet put themselves in Motion on either Side for any Enterprize of Confequence.
