

Whitehall, Aug. 29, 1735.

Whereas two anonymous Letters were lately sent to Mr. John Kerr, in Norris-street in the Hay-market, requiring him to lay Ten Pounds in a certain Place, and at the Time therein mentioned, and threatening, in case of Noncompliance, to burn his House, and to kill the first Person who should come out of his said House: And whereas on Tuesday last, the 26th Instant, in the Night-time, the House of Mr. Nicholas Read, Haberdasher, at the Corner of the same Street, in the Hay-Market, was attempted to be burnt, by putting Rags and Paper under the Door, and setting them on Fire by a Train of Gunpowder, which burnt Part of the Floor and Shop Door: Her Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in the said Crimes, is pleased to promise her most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices in either of the said Crimes, so as they, or any of them, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
