It is now said, that the Number of Imperialists designed to be sent to the Austrian Netherlands will be 50000, that Count Seckendorff is to command them, and it is thought they will take their March by the Country of Juliers. The Duke of Modena sets out from hence to Morrow for Calais, in order to pass over to England. It is advised from Loo, that the Princes Royal and the Prince of Orange will repair hither the Beginning of next Month, in order to reside here for some Time.
