ON Thursday the 6th Instant, Sir Everard Fawkener, Kt. His Majesty's Ambassadour to the Ottoman Port, set out from hence for Vienna in his Way to Constantinople.

Hague, Oct. 11, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland continue their Assembly, in some Expectation that the Answer of the Powers in Alliance against the Emperor to the last Propositions made to them for restoring Peace, may without longer Delay be transmitted hither and communicated to them: In the mean Time, they have under Consideration a Scheme for raising Money for the publick Service by a Lottery, the Prizes of which are to be Annuities for Life. Letters from Germany give an Account, that Prince Eugene left the Imperial Army on the 5th Instant to return to Vienna, leaving the Command of that Army to the Duke of Wirtemberg: That Count Seckendorff continued his March towards Coblenz, in order to pass through the Country of Juliers and cross the Maese at Ruremonde or thereabouts; and that the Count de Belleisle not having been able to obstruct his March, had judged it best to post his Troops in such Manner as to hinder the Imperialists from taking their Way by the Countries of Triers and Luxembourg. It is advised from Ruremonde, that Orders were come thither for providing Quarters for two Regiments of Cuirassiers.

Stamp-Office, Sept. 27, 1735.

Whereas a Bill of Indictment was (at the last Assizes held for the County of Lancaster) found against Robert Whitworth, of Manchester, for uttering Counterfeit Stamp Paper, to which he pleaded Guilty; and where-as Joshua Dean was at the last Sessions at the Old Bailey, convicted of impressing Paper with Counterfeit Stamps, and the Commissioners for managing His Majesty's Stamp Duties having discover'd that great Quantities of Paper stamp'd with counterfeit Stamps of several Denominations, have been lately vend'd by the above mentioned Offenders and their Accomplices, (several Parcels whereof have been by the Persons to whom they were sold, sent to this Office,) and there being great Reason to apprehend, that there may yet remain in the Custody of other Persons some of those counterfeit Stamps; the Commissioners have thought it requisite to caution all Persons against Selling any such counterfeit Stamp Paper, for preventing the Danger they will thereby incur, and to require their sending the same to this Office forthwith to be cancell'd, such counterfeit Stamps being of no Value or Use, by Reason the Deeds, Instruments, or Writings written thereon are not valid in Law or Equity; the Stamps which have been discover'd to be counterfeit, are Double Penny Stamps, Double Sixpenny, Treble Sixpenny, One Shilling, and Two Shillings and Three Penny Stamps.
