Lisbon, September 27, N.S.

N the 11th Instant, the Rio de Janeiro Fleet, consisting of Twelve Merchant Ships, together with a Man of War of 64 Guns, arrived here from thence in 109 Days, with a Cargo of Gold, Silver, Diamonds, and other Effects.

Berlin, Oct. 11, N. S. Yesterday Colonel Sommerlat arrived at Wusterhausen from Wolfenbuttel, with am Account that the Dutchess of Brunswick Wolfenbuttel, our King's Daughter, was brought to bed of a Prince on the 9th at Five in the Morning, whereupon his Prussian Majesty ordered a general Salvo to be made by 20 Cannon that are at Wusterhausen, whence 'tis said his Majesty will remove To-morrow to Potsdam, in order to proceed to Wolfenbuttel, to be present at the Christening of the said Prince.

Hanover, Oct. 16, N. S. The King has been pleased to grant unto the Honourable and Reverend Richard Trevor, Master of Arts and one of his Majesty's Chaplains in Ordinary, the Place and Dignity of a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Christ in the University of Oxsord, void by the Decease of Dr. Thomas Terry, late Canon thereof. On the 12th Instant M. de Munich, Minister of the Duke of Wolsenbuttel, arrived here from Brunswick, and having been admitted to an Audience of the King, notified, on the Part of the Duke his Master, that the Dutchess of Wolsenbuttel, had been happily delivered of a Prince on the 9th Instant, to the great Joy of that Court. On the 14th, the said Minister, having taken Leave of His Majesty, set out on his Return to Brunswick, whither M. Borcke, Minister of the King of Prussia, is likewise gone, who took Leave of His Majesty the Day before, expecting, to meet there the King his Master.
