## PRESENT,

The Queen's most Excellent Majesty, Guardian of the Kingdom of Great Britain, and His Majesty's Lieutenant within the same, in Council.

Her Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, That the Parliament which Hands prorogued to Tuesday the 14th of this Instant, should be further prorogued to Tuesday the 11th Day of November next.

Hanover, October 19, N. S. The King proposing, in Case he receives Advice of the Yachts being arrived at Helvoetsluys, to depart from hence for England on the 29th Instant, the Right Hon. the Lord Harrington has obtained his Majesty's Permission to fet out for Holland on Sunday Morning next.

Kensington, October 11. This being the Anniversary of their Majesties Coronation, there was a numerous and splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction. At Noon the Guns in St. James's Park and at the Tower were fired; and at Night there were Bonsires, Illuminations, Ringing of Bells, and all publick Demonstrations of Joy throughout London and Westminster.
