**M.** Hop, Minister of the States General, who is newly arrived from Hanover, has obtained their High Mightinesses Permission to stay here 12 or 15 Days for settling his private Affairs before he goes over to England. M. de Chavigny, Minister from the most Christian King, who is also arrived from Hanover, sets out on Tuesday next for Paris, in order to proceed from thence to England. The Lord Harrington, Principal Secretary of State to the King of Great Britain, is expected here on his Journey from Hanover To-morrow.

Saturday last being the Anniversary of their Majesties Coronation, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison which were drawn out upon Oxmantown Green. At Noon there was a numerous Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment his Grace the Lord Lieutenant upon this Occasion. His Grace, attended with the Guard of Battle-axes, and a Squadron of Horse, made a Tour upon the Strand. After which his Grace returned to the Castle, where there was a magnificent Entertainment for several of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction. In the Evening there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
