N Thursday the 6th Instant, the three Troops of Lise Guards were reviewed by his Catholick Majesty in a Plain about a League from St. Ildesons; and there was a numerous Concourse of Spectators. These Troops were new cloathed, and made an extraordinary fine Appearance. Mr. Keene, his Britannick Majesty's Minister at this Court, gave the same Day a splendid Entertainment to his Excellency M. Patinho, the Foreign Ministers, the Captains of the Lise Guards, and several General Officers, at his House at Pellejeros, which was about a Quarter of a League distant from the Camp. On Thursday the 20th Instant the Court is to remove from St. Ildesons, and to come the same Day to the Escurial, where the Apartments are sitting up for the Reception of their Catholick Majesties.

Hague, Nov. 1, N. S. The States of Holland are immoned to meet on the 9th Inftant, and the Grand Pensionary proposes to affist in their Assembly. This Asternoon arrived an Express from Hanover, with Advice that the King was to set out from thence this Evening for Helvoetsluys, where it is reckoned his Majesty will arrive on Friday next, the 4th, by Noon. The Lord Harrington will go thither on Thursday. M. de Chavigny sets out To-morrow Morning for Paris. The Count de Montijo, and other Foreign Ministers, who were at Hanover, are arrived here. This Morning Earl Stanhope went from hence to imbark on the Packet-

boat for England.
