THE States of Holland are separated for Eight Days. The Prince's Royal and the Prince of Orange arrived here last Saturday Morning in a Yacht from Utrecht. Yesterday Morning his Highness went to visit the Presidents of the three Colleges, the States General, the Council of State, and the Chamber of Accounts; and some few Hours after the Presidents waited on his Highness to compliment him on the Part of their respective Colleges. The Imperial Troops begin to arrive upon the Frontiers of this State, and 800 Hussars have already taken their Winter Quarters at Bray, between Boisselud and Maestricht.
