**L**etters from Poland of the 9th Instant bring Advice, that the Diet of Warsaw broke up on the 7th without Success; and that the same Day King Augustus, with the Consent of the Grand Council, composed of the three Orders of the Republick, had disposed of the vacant Employments Civil and Military. The Review of the Ten Thousand Prussians, who are by this Time arrived at Magdebourg, Halberstadt, &c. is fixed for the 24th Instant, after which his Prussian Majesty will return to his Residence here, where he proposes to spend the whole Winter.

*Hague, Nov. 25, N. S.* The Assembly of the States of Holland remains fixed for Wednesday next, when they will very probably confirm their Resolution for a Lottery of Three Millions of Florins by Way of Annuities. The Place of Droffard of Breda, vacant by the Death of M. Catwyck, is not yet disposed of. The States General, who had resolved by a Majority of Votes to grant for the future a Subsistence to their Sea Officers who are not actually in Service, having resumed the said Proposition, it was entirely rejected by another Majority.
