W E your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Commons of Ireland in Parliament assembled, beg Leave to feture your Majesty our humble Thanks for your Majefty's most gracious Answer to the Addrefs of this Houfe : And at the fame Time to congratulate your Majesty upon your fafe Return to Great Britain, and upon your refuming the Administration of these your Dominions to justly delegated to your Royal, Confort, and fo wifely conducted by Her due

ring your Majesty's Ablence, Your Majesty's great Goodnels and Con-delcention in recommending to our Care the Hempen and Flaxen Manufactures of this Kingdom, must excite in us the warmest Gra-titude,, when we reflect, that the particular Mark of Duty your Majesty expects from us, is to confult our own Interest, and to pursue our own Prosperity.

We are too fenfible of the many Bleffings we enjoy in common with our Fellow Subjects under your Majesty's aufpicious Reign, to omit any Opportunity of expressing our Confidence in a Prince, who thinks a paternal Care of his People to be his trueft Glory;

and who chules rather to make them the Envy, than the Terror of other Nations. We have nothing more to defire than the Continuance of fuch Happinels, being fully convinced, That the Welfare and Safety of this Kingdom entirely depend upon your Majesty's facred Person, and the Proteftant Succession in your Royal House.
