ON Monday last the King of Prussia came to Potzdam, having finished the Reviews of his Troops about Magdeburg and Halberstadt. The Ten Thousand Prussians lately come from the Rhine, are, in a few Days, to pass thro' this Place in their Way to Prussia. The Artillery and Hussars are actually arrived; and, as these were their former Quarters, they will remain here. Two Days ago, young M. Sec-kendorff regulated in a Conference with the Prussian Ministers, the Sum to be given to his Prussian Majesty for quartering the above-mentioned Troops in his own Dominions, and it amounts to 100000 Florins.

Hague, Dec. 13, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland adjourned on the 9th to the 16th Instant. A Committee of Deputies of each of the Provinces is to meet To-morrow for the first Time, to examine the Proposition lately made of a Promotion of General Officers.
