THE Spanish Ambassadour having received Letters by a Courier from the Court of Madrid, had a Conference Yesterday with the Ministers of this State, and soon after it was over dispatched the Courier back again. Neither the Count d'Uhlefeld his Imperial Majesty's Minister, nor the Marquis de Fenelon the French Ambassadour, have yet communicated in Form to the States, the Preliminaries settled between the Emperour and his most Christian Majesty. Yesterday those two Ministers began to make Visits mutually to each other, which they had not done before since the Time the War broke out between their Masters. The Lord Crawford is arrived here from Germany, where he made the Campaign in the Imperial Army; he proposes to proceed for England within a few Days, being accompanied by a Nephew of Count Secken-dorff's.

Yesterday his Grace the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the House of Peers, and being seated on the Throne, with the usual Ceremony, his Grace sent for the Commons, and gave the Royal Assent to the Bills following, viz.

An Act for granting and continuing to His Majesty an additional Duty on Beer, Ale, Strong Waters, Wine, Tobacco, and other Goods and Merchandises therein mentioned.

An Act for granting to His Majesty a further additional Duty on Wines, Silk, Hops, China, Earthen, Japaned or Laquered Ware and Vases; and also a Tax of Four Shillings in the Pound on all Salaries, Profits of Employments, Fees and Pensions; to be applied to pay an Interest of Five Pounds per Cent. per Annum, for the Sum of Three Hundred thousand Pounds, or such Part thereof as shall remain unpaid on the Twentieth Fifth Day of December One thousand seven hundred and thirty five, and towards the Discharge of the said principal Sum.
