A Report has been lately spread here, as if King Stanislaus was soon to remove from Koningsberg to Stetin. They write from the former Place, that there are great Confusions and Divisions amongst the little Court there, on Account of the Arrears of Pay due to the Officers who have served King Stanislaus. In some Words which lately arose upon that Subject between General Steinflicht and one Colonel Osten, the Colonel gave the General a Box on the Ear: They are both under Arrest, and we do not yet know how that Matter will end. Young Count Finckenstein, his Prussian Majesty's Conseiller d'Ambassade at Stockholm, is forthwith to be recalled at the Desire of his Relations.

Hague, Jan. 20, N. S. The States of Holland having now under Consideration the repairing the Dikes in North Holland, which are in a ruinous Condition, design to continue their Assembly next Week. 'Tis advised from Sturgard, that the Prince of Lorraine, Brother to the Duke, passed through that Place in his Way to Vienna on the 10th Instant.
