Hambourg, February 28, N. S.

THE King of Denmark having sent repeated Orders to General Morner, who commanded the Danish Troops on the Rhine and the Moselle, to repair with all Speed to Copenhagen, and leave the Command of the Danish Troops to the Lieutenants General Amthor and Scholten, General Morner arrived here last Thursday, and continued his Journey Yesterday to the Court of Denmark; where some think the King wants to take his Advice upon the March of his Troops, and that there is a Design of quartering them in the Hamburger Territories, upon their Return to this Neighbourhood. The Posts from all Parts are wanting, by Reason of the Frost, which renders the Passage of the Rivers very troublesome and dangerous.

Hague, March 6, N. S. Letters from Vienna of the 22d past relate, that on the 18th an Express was sent from that Court directly to Madrid, with Dispatches supposed to be of Importance in the present Juncture. On the 19th the Emperour made a Promotion of 168 Chamberlains, among whom are some Persons of Distinction who are Protestants, on Occasion of the Marriage of his eldest Daughter with the Duke of Lorrain. His Imperial Majesty had also created 12 new Knights of the Golden Fleece, and 24 new Privy Counsellors, on the same Occasion; all whose Names would soon be published. 'Tis advised from Ostend, that the late high Tide had broke over the Sluyces, and done great Damage to that Place. The Count d'Aldembourg, and the Princess of Hesse his Consort, arrived here last Night from Germany. The States of Holland will assemble To-morrow, most of the Deputies being already arrived here.
