**T**HE Vice-Chancellor of Lithuania, Prince Czartoriski, who has been ever since the Troubles began in this Country at Cosbing in Pomerania, is arrived at Dantzick, where M. Poniatowski and several others of that Family are, and designs to return hither with them for another Diet, which is talk'd of for the Month of June. The Primate arrived here some Days ago from the Country, and was well received at Court. M. Ofalenski, Great Treasurer of Poland, is expected here soon. It is said this Court came Yesterday to an Agreement with the Palatin of Lublin concerning those Gentlemen that are still at Konigsberg in the Interest of King Stanislaus, but the Particulars are not yet known.

His Majesty having been pleased, by Commission under the Great Seal of Great Britain, to appoint the Right Hon. John Lord Delawar, Baron Delawar, West, Cantilupe, Ewyas, Tregoz and Greiffie, Treasurer of His Majesty's Household, One of the Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and Knight of the most Honourable Order of the Bath, to negotiate, conclude, and sign a Treaty of Marriage, between his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, and the Princess Augusta Sister to his most illustrious Highness the Duke of Saxe Gotha, his Lordship will set out in a few Days to execute the said Commission.

An humble Address to His Majesty from the President, Council, and Assembly, of the Island of Barbadoes; As also an humble Address to His Majesty from the Grand Jury of Barbadoes, at the Court of Grand Sessions of Oyer and Terminer General Goal Delivery and General Sessions of the Peace held for the Body of that Island at the Town-Hall in St. Michael's Town, on the 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th of December, 1735, having been transmitted to his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, have by him been presented to His Majesty, who was pleased to receive them very graciously.

His Majesty has been pleased to grant unto the Right Honourable, George Earl of Cholmondeley, the Office of Chamberlain of the County Palatin, of Chester, during his Life.

Stamp Office, March 2, 1735.

Whereas by Two several Acts of Parliament of the 10th Year of her late Majesty Queen Anne, and the 11th Year of his late Majesty, it is enacted, that the following Duties should be paid to his Majesty, (that is to say) For every Sheet of Paper, upon which any Journal, Mercury, or other News Paper whatsoever, should be printed, a Duty of One Penny Sterling, and for every Half-Sheet thereof the Sum of One Halfpenny Sterling; and that if any Person should print, utter, sell, or expose the same to Sale, before the same shall appear to be duly stamped, according to the Directions of the said Acts, every Person so offending should, for every Offence, forfeit Ten Pounds, together with full Costs of Suit. And whereas Thomas Read hath been lately convicted of the said Penalty with Costs of Suit, before Sir William Thomson, Recorder of the City of London, and Sir Edward Bellamy, for selling the London Penny Post before the same was stamped, according to the Directions of the said Acts; and the said Commissioner's having received Information, that notwithstanding the Conviction of the said Read, several Persons have, and continue to print and utter several publick News-papers without having the same stamped, as is required by the said Acts, do hereby give Notice, that they will hereafter prosecute with the utmost Severity, all those that shall print, sell, utter, or expose to Sale, any News-paper whatsoever before the same shall be duly stamped, according to the Directions of the said Act.
