Queldap March o. to Saturday March 13: 1735.

Hague, March 2c, N.S. HE States of Holland separated last Saturday, without coming to any Resolution on several Domestick Affairs they had before them, and particularly a Project to stop a Branch of the Maese running into the Wael, for the Benefit of the Town of Dort, whose Waters are daily filled up with Sands to the Detriment of the Navigation; but it is judged would be cleared of those Sands by the Force that by this Means would be added to A large Quantity of Goods the Stream. going from this Country for Francfort, being lately seized in their Passage through the Territories of the Elector Palatine, on Pretence the Value was not declared in order to the Payment of the Duties: there being amongst the Goods 150,000 Florins in Gold, and several Merchants of Amsterdam being concerned in them, the States have by M. Burmannia their Minister, interposed therein, and demanded the Restitution of the said Goods and Gold; whereupon the Palatine Minister declared Yesterday to their High Mightinesses, that the Goods are already ordered to be restored, and that the Gold will likewise be delivered to the Owners, provided the Duties payable on the same be secured for the future.

Dublin, March 2, Yesterday being her Majesty's Birth-day, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, who were drawn out upon Oxmantown Green. At Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment his Grace the Lord Lieutenant; before whom an Ode set to Musick was perform'd. In the Evening a Play was given by his Grace to the Ladies. At Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other usual Demonstrations of Joy throughout the City; and at the Castle there was a Ball in the great Hall, which was fitted up for that Purpose; and afterwards a magnificent Entertainment in the Council Chamber, to a vast Number of Persons of Distinction of both Sexes.

This Day the Abbe Pareti, Minister from the Duke of Modena, had his first private Audience of His Majesty; to which he was introduced by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.
