Y the laft Letters from Konigsberg, we have Advice, that King Staniflaus left that Place on the 27th Inftant, and was gone to Angersburg, where he proposed to pass the Easter Holy-days, and afterwards to proceed on his Re-turn to France. These Letters affirm that he is to take his Journey thro' this Town, and will even make fome Stay here. roocoo Florins, due from the Emperour to his Prufian Majefty, on Account of Winter Quarters, have been remitted hither by Bills of Exchange.

Hague, April 6, N.S. We have an Ac-count by the last German Post, that the Count of Hanau died on the 28th of March, in his 71st Year, without leaving any of the Male Line of his Family to succeed him ; but that the Houle of Heffe Caffel claiming the Suc-ceffion to that Country by Virtue of ancient Contracts, fome Heifian Troops had taken Posleifion of the Town of Hanau. We are likewife informed here, that King Staniflaus left Konigsberg to return to France on the 27th of March, propoling to také Berlin in his Way, but to stay there only 24 Hours.
