Berlin, March 31, N. S.

BY the last Letters from Konigsberg, we have Advice, that King Stanislaus left that Place on the 27th Instant, and was gone to Angersburg, where he proposed to pass the Easter Holidays, and afterwards to proceed on his Return to France. These Letters affirm that he is to take his Journey thro' this Town, and will even make some Stay here: 100000 Florins, due from the Emperour to his Prussian Majesty, on Account of Winter Quarters, have been remitted hither by Bills of Exchange:

Hague, April 6, N. S. We have an Account by the last German Post, that the Count of Hanau died on the 28th of March, in his 71st Year, without leaving any of the Male Line of his Family to succeed him; but that the House of Hesse Cassel claiming the Succession to that Country by Virtue of ancient Contracts, some Hessian Troops had taken Possession of the Town of Hanau. We are likewise informed here, that King Stanislaus left Konigsberg to return to France on the 27th of March, proposing to take Berlin in his Way, but to stay there only 24 Hours:

Yesterday his Grace the Lord Lieutenant went to the House of Peers, with the usual Solemnity, and gave the Royal Assent to,

An Act for the better Regulating of Juries.

An Act for the further Encouragement and Improvement of the Flaxen and Hempen Manufactures.

An Act for the more effectual assigning of Judgments, and for the more speedy Recovery of Rents by Distress.

An Act for encouraging the Planting of Timber Trees.

An Act to prevent the Evil arising by the Retailers of Beer, Ale, Brandy, Rum, Ge-

neva, Aqua-Vite, and other Spirituous Liquors, giving Credit to Servants, Day-Labourers, and other Persons, who usually Work or Ply for Hire or Wages.

An Act for preventing Frauds and Abuses committed in the making and vending unsound, adulterated and bad Drugs and Medicines.

And to several other Bills.

Whitehall, March 26, 1736.

Whereas His Majesty, by His Royal Proclamation, issued, by the Advice of His Privy Council, upon the 5th Day of February last, in order to bring the Persons to condign Punishment, who, in September last, had been guilty of wilfully and maliciously cutting down and destroying the Turapikes at Ledbury in the County of Hereford; erected by Authority of Parliament, and who were concerned in the Attack then made on the House of John Skipp; Esq; one of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said County, and who had been since guilty of several other notorious Outrages and Disturbances in the said County of Hereford, particularly mentioned in the said Proclamation, was graciously pleased to promise a Pardon to any of the Persons concerned in the said Outrages, upon such Terms as are mentioned in the said Proclamation, provided they made such Discoveries, as are therein particularly mentioned, before the 10th Day of March then next ensuing: And was likewise graciously pleased to offer a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to any Person or Persons, who, before the said 10th Day of March, should discover, and apprehend any of the Persons therein mentioned, or any other Person or Persons guilty of the Offences therein mentioned, so as he, she, or they might be convicted of the same. And whereas the Time for making such Discoveries is now past, and it hath been represented to His Majesty, That, in order to bring the said Offenders to Justice, it may be proper to enlarge the same, His Majesty therefore is pleased to enlarge the Time of such Discovery to the 3d Day of April next, and is hereby graciously pleased to promise the like Pardon, and to give the same Reward, as is mentioned in the said Proclamation, to any Person or Persons, as shall make such effectual Discoveries, as are therein mentioned, at any Time before the Third Day of April next, and upon the same Terms and Conditions, as is mentioned and expressed in the said Proclamation.
