A MIDST the publick Expressions of Joy, permit us, most Gracious Sovereign, with Hearts sull of Duty and Loyalty, to congratulate your Majesty on the Marriage of his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales with the Princess Augusta, a Princess sprung from an illustrious House, from whom the Reformation found the earliest Protection.

Your Majesty has always consulted our Happiness in your just and mild Government, and fecuring to us the Bleffings of Peace; but in this Instance, that of Posterity, who we hope, to latest Times, may be rul'd by Protestant Princes descended from this illustrious Pair.

And as we are truly sensible of the inestimable Blessings we enjoy under your Majesty's Government, we most humbly beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that we shall in our several Stations, use our utmost En-deavours to make your Reign over us happy and easy to your Majesty.

From a Marriage thus auspiciously begun may reasonably be expected a Royal Issue, who like their illustrious Ancestors, will be always foremost in the Cause of Truth and
