T is advised from Altena, that the King of Denmark finds himself so well at present, that he intends to hold a Council on Monday next, and talks of re-viewing the Troops himself, before the End of this Month. The Queen of Denmark was let Blood on the 8th Inftant by way of Frecaution; she appears to have suffer'd much from Anxiety and want of Rest, but does not yet perceive any Alteration in her Health. The Duke, Administrator of Mecklenburg, Charles Louis, arrived in this Town the 6th Inftant, with the Prince his eldest Son, defigning to wait upon the King of Denmark, but his Majesty's Indisposition not permitting it, he went back the 13th to Mecklenburg, yet will return hither again when he hears his faid Majesty is in a Condition to receive him. The Reigning Margrave of Bareith is come to Altena, to pay his Court to the King his Uncle, who, notwithstanding his Illness, has already seen him since his Arrival. His Highness is much distinguished; two Gentlemen of the King's Bedchamber, besides Guards and ordinary Domesticks, are appointed to attend him; and his Majesty's

Denmark has had two small Returns of his Ague, which prevented his holding the intended Council on Monday last; and as two or three Fits more are still expected, though they grow every Time shorter and shorter, it is thought his Majesty will not be able to meddle with the Expedition of his Affairs for

these Eight or Ten Days yet.

Three a-Clock the King of Prusha set out from Potzdam on his Progress to Magdebourg: Of all the Foreign Ministers here, the Marquess de la Chetardie only accompanies his Prussian Majesty. General Pretorius, the Da-

nish Minister, was indeed desired to be of this Journey, but he is not yet come back from Holstein, whither he went a few Weeks ago in order to pay his Duty to the King his Master.

Hanover, June 19, N.S. M. Munch, who was fent hither on the Part of his most Serene Highness the Duke of Wolsenbuttel, to compliment the King on his safe Arrival in his German Dominions, had this Day at Noon his Audience of Leave: Two Deputies of the City of Bremen were likewise at the same time introduced to an Audience of the King, and complimented his Majesty on the Part of their Republick upon his Arrival here.
