*Petersbourg, May 29, N. S.*

**T**HE last Letters this Court have received from Felt Marshal Munich are dated the 4th of May, and advise, that he was then 180 Verst (which is about 130 English Miles) from Precop, where he expected to arrive with his Army the 14th of the same Month, and was in hopes to make himself Master of that important Pass in Six or Eight Days, and then to penetrate into the Crimea. It is said Count Munich raised a great many Redouts at several Places in the Desert as he passed, in which he has left small Garrisons, to secure a Communication between him and Russia, that every thing his Troops may want may be sent him from Samara, without running the Risk of being taken by the stragglers Tartars in the Desert. Last Thursday Evening Young Count Munich, one of the Gentlemen of her Majesty's Bedchamber, set out for Warsaw, in order to carry to the King of Poland the Czarina's Order of St. Andrew. The Princess of Radzeville, and her Son, are gone from hence for Warsaw; the Czarina was graciously pleased to give the Princess, before she left this Place, her Picture set with Diamonds; Ten Thousand Rubbles in ready Money, and three fine Sable Furs; in Consideration of the great Services her Family have done King Augustus, in the late Troubles in Poland.

*Stockholm, June 8.* The King of Sweden, and Senate, have resolved to acknowledge King Augustus of Poland, whose Minister M. Utterodt, is gone this Afternoon to Carlberg, to pay his Court to their Swedish Majesties on this Occasion. Count Ferfen was buried the 30th past in the Evening, with great Pomp and State; when the Ceremony was over at Church, they fired Ninety Six Guns. He has left a vast Estate behind him, and three Children. It is said that President Stromfeld in the Chamber of Finances, will succeed Count Ferfen as President of the Parliament.

*Warsaw, June 13, N. S.* The Primate is returned hither from his Seat at Lowitz, in order to be present at the Conferences with the Russian Minister, which are fixed for 15 Days before the General Diet begins. The Palatin of Podolia Count Hamiecki, died lately; he was a firm Adherent to King Augustus, very active in promoting his Interest, and was also much beloved among the Nobility. As that Palatinate is on the Frontier of Turkey, it is of Consequence to have a Person in whom the Court can confide, to fill

that Office. Orders are already given for reducing 10 Men out of each Troop of the Saxon Regiments of Horse.

*Hambourg, June 23, N. S.* The King of Denmark continues much in the same Way, troubled still with periodical Returns of his Distemper, tho' he is upon the mending Hand. Many Affairs require his Consideration, and Papers of several Kinds lie ready for his signing, but his Majesty is not yet able to attend to any Business; and there is so little Likelihood of his appearing soon in publick, that several of those who came hither to make their Court, are gone back, to wait his Recovery, to the Places of their Abode. His Majesty probably intends to spend the Summer at Altena, since to remedy the Inconveniences of his Lodging, they are adding to it a new Building of Timber, which is to contain a large Room for Audiences. As the Treaty between the King of Denmark and the Town of Hambourg wants nothing to compleat it but the formal Exchange of the Ratifications, which is only delayed by reason of his Danish Majesty's Illness, the Court has thought fit, in the mean time, to take away the Guards posted upon the Avenues in Holstein; so that the Trade of this City with the Danish Dominions is no longer obstructed.

*Hanover, June 26, N. S.* His Majesty has been pleased to appoint M. Albydel, Councillor of War, to be Councillor of the Chamber of the Finances. On Sunday last M. Hammerstein, who came hither on the Part of her most serene Highness the First Dutchess Dowager of Wolfenbuttel, Consort of the late Duke Augustus William, to compliment the King on his safe Arrival in his German Dominions, had his Audience of Leave of his Majesty, and set out in the Evening on his Return for Brunswick. The same Day M. Harlingue was introduced to the King, and complimented his Majesty on the Part of his most serene Highness the Prince of Orange, on his Majesty's Arrival. Yesterday M. Alt, Secretary from the King of Sweden as Landgrave of Hesse Cassel, was introduced to the King at Herrenhausen by the Marquess de la Forest, Grand Chamberlain of his Majesty's Household. The Baron d'Assebourg had likewise Yesterday an Audience of the King, in which he complimented his Majesty upon his Arrival here, on the Part of his Master the Elector of Cologne; as did M. de Nischurtz, on the Part of the Prince of Nassau Dillenburg; and the Baron de Riedesel, on that of the Landgrave of Hesse Darmstadt.

Hague, June 29, N. S. Count Golowkin has this Day notified to the States by their President, the News of a great Victory gained by the Muscovite Army commanded by General Munich over the Tartars, who being in Number One Hundred Thousand, as 'tis said, very well intrenched, to defend the Passage into the Crimea by Precop, were entirely defeated on the 28th of May last, and the Cham had much ado to make his Escape. The States of Holland are actually sitting upon their Domestick Affairs, and the Town of Gorcum having protested against their last Resolution concerning the Waters of the Maese for the Town of Dort, great Debates amongst them have arisen thereupon. The States seem now resolved to leave their Garrisons as they are till next Year.
