Petersbourg, May 29, N. S. H E last Letters this Court have received from Felt Marshal Munich are dated the 4th of May, and ad-vife, that he was then 180 Verft (which is about 130 English Miles) from Precop, where he expected to arrive with his Army the 14th of the lame Month, and was in hopes to make himfelf Mafter of that important Pass in Six or Eight Days, and then to penetrate into the Crimea. It is faid Count Munich raifed a great many Redouts at feveral Places in the Defert as he paffed, in which he has left finall Garri-fons, to fecure a Communication between him and Russia, that every thing his Troops may want may be fent him from Samara, without running the Risk of being taken by the ftraggling Tartars in the Defert. Latt Thurfday Evening Young Count Munich, one of the Gentlemen of her Majefty's Bedchamber, fet out for Warfaw, in order to carry to the King of Poland the Czarina's Order of St. Andrew. The Princess of Rad-zeville, and her Son, are gone from hence for Warlaw; the Czarina was gracioully pleafed to give the Princefs, before the left this Place, her Picture set with Diamonds; Ten Thouland Rubbles in ready Money, and three fine Sable Furs ; in Confideration of the great Services her Family have done King Auguf-

services her Family have done king Augurtus, in the late Troubles in Poland. Stockholm, June 8. The King of Sweden, and Senate, have refolved to acknowledge King Auguftus of Poland, whofe Minifter M. Utterodt, is gone this Afternoon to Carlberg, to pay his Court to their Swedith Majefties on this Occafion. Count Ferfen was buried the 30th paft in the Evening, with great Pomp and State; when the Ceremony was over at Church, they fired Ninety Six Guns. He has left a vaft Eftate behind him, and three Children. It is faid that Prefident Stromfeld in the Chamber of Finances, will fucceed Count Ferfen as Prefident of the Parliament.

Warfaw, June 13, N. S. The Primate is returned hither from his Seat at Lowitz, in order to be prefent at the Conferences with the Ruffian Minister, which are fixed for 15 Days before the General Diet begins. The Palatin of Podolia Count Hamiecki, died lately; he was a firm Adherent to King Augustus, very active in promoting his Interest, and was also much beloved among the Nobility. As that Palatinate is on the Frontier of Turkey, it is of Confequence to have a Perfon in whom the Court can confide, to fill

that Office. Orders are already given for reducing 10 Men out of each Troop of the Saxon Regiments of Horfe.

Hambourg, June 23, N. S. The King of Denmark continues much in the fame Way, troubled still with periodical Returns of his Diftemper, tho' he is upon the mending Hand. Many Affairs require his Confideration, and Papers of feveral Kinds lie ready for his figning, but his Majesty is not yet able to attend to any Bufiness; and there is fo little Likelihood of his appearing foon in publick, that feveral of those who came hither to make their Court, are gone back, to wait his Recovery, to the Places of their Abode. His Majefty probably intends to fpend the Summer at Altena, fince to remedy the Inconvenier at Artena, inde to tenddy the inderte-niences of his Lodging, they are adding to it a new Building of Timber, which is to con-tain a large Room for Audiences. As the Treaty between the King of Denmark and the Town of Hambourg wants nothing to compleat it but the formal Exchange of the Ratifications, which is only delayed by reafon of his Danish Majesty's Illness, the Court has thought fit, in the mean time, to take away the Guards posted upon the Avenues in Holstein ; fo that the Trade of this City with the Danish Dominions is no longer obstructed.

Hanover, June 26, N. S. His Majefty has been pleafed to appoint M. Albydel, Councellor of War, to be Councellor of the Chamber of the Finances. On Sunday laft M. Hammerftein, who came hither on the Part of her most ferene Highness the First Dutchels Dowager of Wolfenbuttel, Confort of the late Duke Augustus William, to compliment the King on his fafe Arrival in his German Dominions, had his Audience of Leave of his Majefty, and fet out in the Evening on his Return for Brunswick. The fame Day M. Harlingue was introduced to the King, and complimented his Majefty on the Part of his most ferene Highness the Prince of Orange, on his Majefty's Arrival. Yesterday M. Alt, Secretary from the King of Sweden as Landgrave of Hesser Cassed and Chamberlain of his Majefty's Houshold. The Baron d'Asfebourg had likewife Yesterday an Audience of the King, in which he complimented his Majefty upon his Arrival here, on the Part of his Master the Elector of Cologne; as did M. de Nifchurtz, on the Part of the Prince of Nasfau Dillenbourg ; and the Baron do Riedefel, on that of the Landgrave of Hesser Darmftadt.

Hague, June 29, N. S. Count Golowkin has this Day notified to the States by their Prefident, the News of a great Victory gained by the Muſcovite Army commanded by General Munich over the Tartars, who being in Number One Hundred Thouſand, as 'tis faid, very well intrenched, to defend the Paſſage into the Crimea by Precop, were entirely deſeated on the 28th of May laſt, and the Cham had much ado to make his Eſcape. The States of Holland are actually fitting upon their Domeſtick Aſſairs, and the Town of Gorcum having proteſted againſt their laſt Reſolution concerning the Waters of the Maeſe for the Town of Dort, great Debates amongſt them have ariſen thereupon. The States ſeem now reſolved to leave their Garriſons as they are till next Year.
