A PROCLAMATION,

For discovering the Persons concerned in a wicked and or all covering the Perfons concerned in a Wicked and audacious Outrage committed in Wefminsfler-Hall during the Sitting of His Majesty's Courts, upon the 14th of this Instant July; and the Author, Printer, and Publishers of a false, malicious, and treasonable Libel then and there dispersed.

W HEREAS upon Wednefday the Fourteenth Day of this Instant July, being the last Day of Trinity Term, about the Hour of Two in the Afternoon, a Parcel or Packet containing feveral Papers and fome Sheets of feveral Acts of Parliament, and likewife a large Quantity of Gunpowder, was laid in Weftminster Hall, near his Majesty's High Court of Chancery, and his Majefty's Court of King's Bench (which were both then fitting) and was foon after-wards fired and blown up, in Contempt and Defiance of the Authority of his Majesty's faid Courts, and to the great Difturbance of his Majefty's Subjects then atten-ding upon the fame : And whereas at the fame Time, by the Explosion of the faid Gunpowder, or otherwife, great Numbers of a false, infamous, and malicious Libel, bearing Date Wednesday July the Fourteenth, One thousand seven hundred and thirty fix, were difperfed about Westminster Hall, in which are contained feveral feditious and treafonable Matters, and feveral falle and fcandalous Reflections upon his Majefty and both Houfes of Parliament, calling Five of the Acts of Parliament which paffed in the laft Seffion by the infa-mous Name of Libels, declaring that they were then publickly burnt in Weftminfter Hall, and other Places therein mentioned, fetting forth the Purport and De-fign of them in falle and fifthious Colours, and re-prefenting them as defructive of the Product, Trade and Manufacture of this Kingdom, and tending to the utter Subversion of the Liberties and Properties thereof, though the fame are plainly calculated for the Prefervation of the Lives, Liberties and Properties of his Majefly's Subjects, for promoting and encouraging the Trade of this Kingdom, and for fecuring the Peace and Welfare thereof: And whereas the Grand Jury of the County of Middlefex, being then fitting, were im-mediately directed by his Majefty's Court of King's Bench to examine into this Matter, and thereupon the faid Grand Jury, being moved with a juft Referement of to daring and infolent an Attempt, did prefent the faid printed Paper as a wicked, falle, infamous, and fcandalous Libel, highly reflecting on his Majefty and the L giflative Power of this Kingdom, and tending very much to alienate, poilon, and difturb the Minds of his Majefty's Subjects, and did allo prefent the Author, Primer, and Publisher of the said wicked, false, infamous, and scandalous Libel, as guilty of a very high Crime and Misdemeanor, and did request and defire his Majefty's faid Court of King's Bench, to give Directions to the proper Officer to make firich Search and En-quiry after the Author, Printer, and Publisher of the said wicked, false, infamous, and scandalous Libel, and

to give Directions to fuch Officer effectually to profecute the Author, Printer and Publisher thereof, in order that they might be brought to condign Punishment for fo great an Offence : And whereas it is highly neceffary that fo audacious and unparalleled an Infult upon his Majefty, and both Houses of Parliament, committed in the Face of his Majefty's two higheft Courts of Juffice then fitting and acting by Virtue of his Majefty's Royal Authority, fhould not efcape unpunished; We therefore, to fhew our just Indignation against the Perfons concerned in fo wicked and abominable an Attempt, and in order to bring them to condign Punifhment, and to deter all others from committing the like Offences for the future, have thought fit, by the Advice of his Majefty's Privy Council, to iffue this Proclamation, and We do hereby strictly charge and command all his Majefty's Juffices, and other Civil Magiftrates whatfoever, that they do make diligent Search and Inquiry after the Perfons concerned in the faid wicked Attempt, and the Author, Printer, and Publishers of the faid wicked and feditious Libel, and that they do apprehend and feize the faid Perfons, and all others whom they fhall find difperfing the faid Libel, and give proper Information thereof, that the faid Offenders may be punifhed according to the ut-moft Rigour of the Law; and We do hereby frictly charge and command all his Majefty's loving Subjects, that they do use their unnost Endeavours to discover and apprehend the laid Offender or Offenders; and for the Encouragement of all Perfons to be diligent and industrious in their Endeavours to make fuch Difcovery, We do hereby promife and declare, that any Perfon or Perfons, who fhall difcover any of the Perfons concerned in the faid wicked Attempt, or the Author, Printer, or Publishers of the faid wicked and treasonable Libel, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders be convicted of the faid Offences, or any of them, fhall have and receive for every fuch Offender fo difcovered and convicted, as aforefaid, the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds, which faid Sum of Two Hundred Pounds for every fuch Offender fo discovered and convicted, the Commiffioners of his Majefty's Treafury, or his High Treafurer for the Time being, are hereby directed ro pay accordingly, without any further or other Warrant in that Behalf. And whereas there is nothing which We more earneftly defire than to fecure the Peace and Profperity of his Majefty's Kingdoms, and to encourage the Trade thereof, and to preferve to all his Ma-jefty's loving Subjects the full Enjoyment of their Rights and Liberties; We do therefore further charge and command all his Majefty's Judges, Juffices of the Peace, and other Civil Magistrates, that they do take the most effectual Care to put in Execution all those good and wholfom Laws which have been made for the Prefervation and Security of the Lives, Liberties, and Properties of his Majesty's Subjects, and for the Encouragement of the Trade of this Kingdom, and particularly those good Laws which were made for this Purpofe in the laft Seffion of Parliament, and which have been to fcandaloufly milreprefented, and to infolently reflected upon in the faid falfe and infamous Libel
