Petersbourg, June 29.

Courier arrived here two Days ago from Felt Marshal Lacy, with Letters dated the 8th Inftant, which advife, that one of the Powder Magazines in Afoph had been blown up by a Bomb; that the Garrifon had made another Sally out of the Town, and had been repulfed, in which Action Felt Marshal Lacy received a flight Wound in the Thigh by a Musket Ball. That the faid General carries on the Siege with fuch Succels, as leaves no Room to doubt his being very foon Mafter of the Place. The fame Day a Courier arrived here in 14 Days from Felt Marshal Munich, with the agreeable News of his having taken the Town of Kofloff, a Place of great Trade, and which has a good Harbour; that there were in the faid Town a great many Greeks and Armenians, and fome Jefuits, which laft are retired to Constantinople. Count Munich mentions, that he was proceeding with his Army in order to attack Bachilaray, the Capital of Crimea, and Refidence of the Cham, which he expected foon to take, it being only fortified with an Earthen Wall. The Czarina alfo received Advice two Days ago from Perecop, that General Leontoff had taken Kuinbour, a Place of great Importance, being fituated on the Mouth of the River Nieper on the Crimea Side. A Courier is just now arrived from the Camp before Afoph, with Advice, that the Governor of that Place had fent four Officers to Felt Marshal Lacy in order to capitulate ; fo that this Court expects every Minute to hear of the Town's being furrendred. A Minister from Persia is arrived here, and had an Audience of the Czarina the 26th Instant, in which he notified to her Majesty, that Tha-mas Kouli Kan had ascended the Throne of

Perfia, and was now called Sophy Nadyr. Hanower, July 22, N. S. His Majefty has been pleafed to appoint Henry Cope, Efq; to be Lieutenant Governor of the Town and Garrifon of Placentia, in Newfoundland in America, in the Room and Place of Samuel Gledhill, Efq; deceafed ; and alfo to appoint William Kennedy Efq; to be Deputy Governor of the Town, Caftle and Fort of Invernefs, in North Britain, and of all the Military Works and Fortifications thereunte belonging, in the Room of James Cunningham, Efq; deceafed. His Majefty has likewife been pleafed to appoint Charles Legge, Efq; to be firft Major, Tobias Cramer, Efq; fecond Major, James Stuart, Efq; Captain, and Charles Ingram, Efq; Captain Lieutenant, in the third Regiment of Foot Guards commanded by the Right Hon. John Earl of Dunmore.

Berlin, July 24, N. S. Baron Brackel has received an Estaffette from his Court, with an Account, that on the 20th of last lifed according to the Jaid Rules and Orders.

Month, O. S. Afoph had furrendred to Felt Marfhal Lacy, and that all the Garrifon had been made Prifoners of War. Hague, July 31, N.S. Count Golowkin had an Account from Petersbourg by the laft Poft, that Aloph had furrendred by Capitulation on the 1ft Inflant, N. S. the Garrifon being made Prifoners of War. He has notified the fame to the States, who fent their Agent Yefterday to compliment him on that Occafion. Count Poniatowsky was expected here laft Night from Amfterdam, where he has been fome Time. There is yet no Day fixed for the Return of the States of Holland. Count Uhlefeld was informed laft Poft from Bruffels, that his Mother, Grande Maitreffe to the Governante, was a dying.
