*Petersbourg, July 3.*

**Y**ESTERDAY Morning one of Felt Marshal Lacy's Sons, who is a Lieutenant Colonel in the Russian Army, arrived here in Twelve Days from Asoph, with the important News that the Garrison of that Place had capitulated and surrendered it to the Russians on the 20th past. Lieutenant Colonel Lacy being immediately introduc'd by Count Biron to the Czarina, presented to her Majesty the Key of Asoph. About an Hour after M. Lacy's arrival here, the Cannon of this Citadel and of the Admiralty were fired, and the Czarina went to the great Church where Te Deum was sung.

*Berlin, July 28, N. S.* They write from Prussia, that M. Marshal de Biberstein, formerly Ambassadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary on the Part of this Court, at the Congress of Utrecht, died lately at his Seat in that Country. General Ginkel, the Dutch Minister, waits only for the King of Prussia's Return hither, in order to take his Leave and to set out for Holland.

*Hamburg, July 28, N. S.* Letters from Denmark of the 24th Instant advise, that the Ministers were arrived at Copenhagen, and that the Royal Family was expected at Friedensburg on the Day following.

Her Majesty has been pleased to order Letters Patents to be passed under the Great Seal of Great Britain, containing his Majesty's Grant to Nathaniel Cooper, the Younger, Esq; of the Office of Vendue Master, in the Island of Jamaica in America.

His Majesty having been graciously pleased by his Warrant under his Royal Sign Manual, dated the 10th of June, 1733, to establish certain Rules and Orders for the better Government of the Charity for the Relief of poor Widows of Commission and Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy: These are to give Notice to all such Widows, whose Husbands died on or since the 30th of August, 1732, that Copies of the said Rules and Orders are lodged with the Commissioners of his Majesty's Navy at Chatham, Portsmouth, and Plymouth, as also with the Clerks of the Cheque at Deptford and Woolwich, and the Naval Officers at Harwich, Deal, and Kinsale; where they may be informed of all Particulars which entitle them to the Benefit of the said Charity, and receive the proper Certificates for that Purpose: But such Widows as live at too great a Distance from the Places above-mentioned, may apply by Letter to Thomas Corbet, Esq; at the Admiralty Office, who will send them all necessary Information. And the Governours of the said Charity intending to distribute some Relief to the Widows of such Sea Officers who died before the 30th of August, 1732, and whose Circumstances come within the Rules of the Establishment; These are to give Notice to all such Widows, to repair or send to the above-mentioned Places, that they may be provided with the proper Certificates. And the Court of Assistants do hereby give Notice, that they shall meet at this Office on Tuesday the 14th of September, at Eight of the Clock in the Morning, in order to receive and adjust the Claims of all such Widows as shall be qualified according to the said Rules and Orders.
