ESTERDAY Morning one of Felt Marthal Lacy's Sons, who is a Lieutenant Colonel in the Ruffian Army, arrived here in Twelve Days from Afoph, with the important News that the Garrifon of that Place had capitulated and furrendred it to the Ruffians on the 20th paft. Lieutenant Colonel Lacy being immediately introduc'd by Count Biron to the Czarina, prefented to her Majefty the Key of Afoph. About an Hour after M. Lacy's arrival here, the Cannon of this Citadel and of the Admiralty were fired, and the Czarina went to the great Church where Te Deum was fung.
