Plymouth, Jan. 31.

Warfam, Fan. 14. His Majefly has of lare been advertis'ds that the Malcontents had fome ill, defigh upon this place and his Royal Person; which notice came by a Letter written from Lowitz, and is feconded with very probable circumflances. How-ever, it made little impression upon the King, who will not be perfyaded to the from hence, how craftilly foever the defign of the Faction was laid, to move him to it. 'Tis fait, that this difcontent-ted party hath feur one of their Cabale to the Tarears, to tollicite them to make a new irruption in-tothis Kingdom, thereby to foread a greater confufion than ever over the Land. No great matter hath been done in our Aflembly, fince the departure of the Bifhop of Cracow, and the Palatine of Witepsky in Lituanies who are gone in the quality of Media-tors for Lowitz, to found upon what measure a generals reconciliation may be chrained. Il laid, that the Generalillimo Sobietsky is not yet come back to Lowit?, and that therefore the Mediators have not been able to make any progress. At the last Assembly 'tis resolved, to pawn the Jewels of the Crown, and fo to raife 100 000 Ducats, chiefly to fatisfy what was promis'd to the Tartars at Leopolis, as also other publick and necessary occasions; though there be many who prefs, that part of those Jewels should be fold outright, to prevent the paying great interest. especially fince it may eafily be foreseen, that the Republick will scarce be able to redeem those Jewels.

Rome, Jan. 14. At Civita Vecchia there was lately launched a ftately new Galley, very richly guilt, which is to ferve for Admiral to the Pope's Squadron. The Cardinal Aquaviva is very fick, and 'tis apprehended he will foon follow the Cardinal Gaaltieri. Cardinal Brancaccio is still indificied, but Cardinal Carpegna, though very antient, is much better than he hath been of late. The Pope feemed to have no defign to make any promotion, before there were 6 or 7 Caps vacant; yet he hath been eafily prevailed with, to confer that Dignity tipon the Abot Felice Rospiglios, to express his acknowledgments to that Family.

Milan, Fan. 18. We are informed, that at Parma and Plaifance that Duke hath given order to all his Subjects, to provide themfelves with Arms and Horfes. We here difcourfe also of making new Leavies, and that for that purpole, fums of Money are to come from Naples and Sicily. News comes from Turin, that the 4000 Men, which are to pals out of the Strvice of Savoy, into that of France, have obtained of the Envoy of his most Christian Majefty, that they shall have the fame Entertainment as the Regiment of *Magalotti*, and to be paid off every Month. From *Genoua* 'tis written, that a French Officer was arrived there, come from *France*. to take fome Troops of that Republick into the Service of his most Christian Majefty; and that he was pefied to *Florence*, to ask permission there for magking Recruits.

Venice, Jan. 21. We have at length been informed by Letters from our Bailo Quirini, refiding at Conftantinople, that the City of Babylon is Befieged by the Perfians, and in danger to be taken in a flort time, if not relieved. That the Grand Signior was expected at Conftantinople, to celebrate the folemnity of the Circumcifion of his eldeft Son, which is ufually made with extraordinary Magnificence, and at which all Ambaffadors and other publick Miniflets, being in that Court, are wont to appear with confiderable Prefents. Signior Girolamo Juffiniani, appointed by this Republick to be Ambaffador in France hath already fent away his Baggage, and himfelf intends flortly to follow down the River Po, and lo by the way of Turin.

Disto, Jan. 28. Saturday last at night arrived berg the Duke of Mantoua, attended by so or 30 of the principal Cavaliers of that City, with divers others of his Court, though his Highnels to enjoy the more freedom, intends to be incognito all the sime of this flay here, 2 of hath therefore given no notice at all, of his arrival to the Senate.

Madrid, Jan. 18. The 12 of this month the Rope's Nuntio faid Maffe in the Kings Chappel, where the Te Doum was fung for the recovery of his Catholique Majefty, the Queen being prefent, and all the Grandees. Service being ended, the faid Nunoio complimented his Majefty, in the prefence of the reft of the Forreign Ministers in this Court, whole mouth he was on that occasion; according to the cuftom of this Court.

Vienna, Jan. 19. We hear out of Npper Huneary, that there had appeared again, beyond the River Tibifcus or Teiffa, a confiderable number of Rebels, which Colonel Smid had formerly driven into the Fort Likkaw, where one Sockay, a Principal Ringleader of that Party, did now defend himfelf with 300 Men, against the faid Colonel, who Bestieges it. The news holds that Babylon is revolted from the heavy yoke of the Turks, to that easing one of the Persians, the King of which latter, is fard to have appointed three Envoys, to three several Courts, viz, of the Emperor, the King of Poland, and the Czar of Muscow, to follicite a frict Confederation against the Turks, on this favourable occasion.

Ditto, Jan. 22. The Spanish Ambassador here is faid to have received Money and Orders to Leavy fome Regiments; which his Imperial Majesty is willing he should take of those Ten, that are now raising in his Dominions. Some days fince, there, was dispatcht a Courier to divers Turkish Officers, Commanding upon the Frontiers, to complain of the refuge they gave to the Rebels of Hungary, as a practile suppos'd to be contrary to the intentions of the Ottoman Court. Here arriv'd lately a Courier

The faid Nuntio is furnisht with Letters of Exchange for 100peo Growns, and hath Orders to offer a million more from the Pope to that Republick, if they will make Wa against the Turks. We have notice that the Hungarian Rebels that are in prifon have confeis'd, that they had three places of retreat in the Territories that are tributary to the Turk, and were punctually pay'd every month, though they knew not whence that Money came.

Bruffels, Feb. 4. The Duke de Duras is still at Warrem in person, though he hath sent away a body of Horie towards the Rhine, which are already joyned with the Maseshal de Turenne ; whereupon we may thorely hear of some confiderable Action between the French and Germans in Westphalia.
