An ACE to prevent the Listing his Majesty's Subjects to serve as Soldiers without his

Majesty"s Licence.

Hereas divers of his Majesty's Subjects have been of late feduced to enlist themselves to serve as Soldiers under foreign Princes, States, or Rotentates, which Practice is highly pre-judicial to the Safety and Welfare of this Kingdom; for Remedy thereof, be it enac-ted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the. Authority of the fame, That if any Subject of the Crown of Great Britain, from and after the Twenty Fourth Day of June next, shall, within the Kingdom of Great Britain, or Ireland, or from and after the 29th, Day of September next, without the same, enlist or enter himself, or if any Person, shall procure any Subject of his Majesty, his Heirs, or Successions, to enlist or enter himself, or hire or retain any Person being a Subject of his Majesty, him Lin Majesty, his Heirs, or Succellors, with an Intent to cause such Person to enlist or enter himself, or procure any Person being a Subject of his Majesty, his Heirs, or Successors, to go beyond the Seas, or embark with an Intent, and in order to be enlifted to ferve any foreign Prince, State, or Potentate, as a Soldier, without Leave or Licence of his Majesty, his Heirs, or Succellors, first had and obtained, for enlisting any of the Subjects of his Majesty, his Heirs, or Successors, to serve any such foreign Prince, State, or Potentate, as Soldiers, under the Sign Manual of his Majesty, his Heirs or Succelfors, every fuch Person so offending, being thereof lawfully convicted, shall be taken, deemed, and adjudged to be guilty of Felony, and shall suffer Death as in Cases of Felo-

hy, without Benefit of Clergy.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That where any Offence against this Act shall be committed out of this Realm, the same may be alledged to be committed, and may be laid, enquired of, and tried, in any

County in England.

Provided always, and be in further enacted by the Authority aforefaid. That in case any Person so enlisted, or invested, or entired to go beyond the Seas, it order to be enlisted as a Non-commissioned Officer, or private Soldier in any foreign Service, without his Majerty's Licence first had and obtained, as aforefuld, shall, within Fourteen Days aften such Enlisting on Agreement to go beyond the Seas, voluntarily discover upon Oath, before any of his Majerty's Justices of the Peace or other civil Magistrate, the Person or Persons

by whom he was so enlisted, inveigled, or erticed, as aforesaid, so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said Offence, such Person or Persons so discovering, as aforesaid, shall be indemnisted from the Penalty inslicted by this Act, and all other Penalties whatsoever on account of the said Offence.
