An Act to prevent the Lifting his Majefty's Subjects to ferve as Soldiers without his Majefty's Licence.

Hereas divers of his Majefty's Subjects have been of late leduced to enlift themfelves to ferve as Soldiers under foreign Princes, States,

or Potentates, which Practice is highly pre-judicial to the Safety and Welfare of this Kingdom; for Remedy thereof, be it enacted by the king's most excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament allembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That if any Subject of the Crown of Great Britain, from and after the Twenty Fourth Day of June next, fhall, within the Kingdom of Great Britain or Ireland, or from and after the 29th Day of September next, without the fame, enlift or enter himfelf, or if any Períon shall procure any Subject of his Majesty, his Heirs, or Succef-fors, to enlist or enter himself, or hire or retain any Person being a Subject of his Majesty, his Heirs, or Succeffors, with an Intent to cause fuch Person to enlist or enter himself, or procure any Perfon being a Subject of his Ma-jefty, his Heirs, or Succeffors, to go beyond the eas, or embark with an Intent, and in order to be enlifted to ferve any foreign Prince, State, or Potentate, as a Soldier, without Leave or Licence of his Majefty, his Heirs, or Succeffors, first had and obtained, for enlisting any of the Subjects of his Majesty, his Heirs, or Succeffors, to ferve any fuch foreign Prince, State, or Potentate, as Soldiers, under the Sign Manual of his Majesty, his Heirs or Succesfors, every fuch Perfon fo offending, being thereof la fully convicted, shall be taken, deemed, and adjudged to be guilty of Felo-ny, and thall fuffer Death as in Cales of Felony, without Benefit of Clergy.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That where any Offence against this Ast shall be committed out of this Realm, the fame may be alledged to be committed, and may be laid, enquired of, and tried, in any County in England.

Provided always, and be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That in cafe any Perfon fo enlifted, or inveigled, or enticed to go beyond the Seas, in order to be enlifted as a Non-commissioned Officer, or private Soldier in any foreign Service, without his Majefty's Licence first had and obtained, as a forefaid, shall, within Fourteen Days after fuch Enlifting or Agreement to go beyond the Seas, voluntarily difcover upon Oath, before any of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace or other civil Magistrate, the Perfon or Perfons by whom he was fo enlifted, inveigled, or en-

ticed, as aforefaid; fo as he or they may be apprehended and convicted of the faid Offence, fuch Perfon or Perfons fo difcovering, as aforefaid, fhall be indemnified from the Penalty inflicted by this Act, and all other Penalties whatfoever on account of the faid Offence.

Copenhagen, Sept. 15, N. S. The King of Denmark, accompanied by the Queen, the Princels Charlotte, and the Margravine, came to the Palace of Fridericksberg on the 11th paft, and this Morning their Majefties are fet out again for Friedensburg. During the Court's fhort Stay in this Neighbourhood, the King was every Day in Town, and fometimes twice a Day. His Majefty dined Yefterday in publick, and feems very happily recovered of his late Illnefs. On the 13th he affifted at the launching of the Fyen, a new built Ship of Fifty Guns, and of the Laland and Langelandt, two fmall Brigantines. His Majefty expressed himfelf to be very well fatisfied with their Building, and was pleafed to confer the Character of Rear Admiral upon M. Suhme, who has the Inspection of the Holm under his Excellency Count Danneskiold. These Ships are the first that have been built fince those Gentlemen have had the chief Direction of the Sea Affairs. M. Stutterhiem, who was the Danish Resident at Hambourg, died there last Week,

Hambourg, died there last Week. Drefden, Sept. 19, N. S. His Polish Ma jefty has made the Prince Royal Governour of Lufatia, being an Office which is always given to the Heir of this Electorate. The Polish Refident at Constantinople has writ to this Court, that the Sultan had at last declared the News of the Russians having taken Aloph, and the Lines of Perecop; which had caufed great Consternation among the People. The Grand Vizier is arrived with his Army at Babada. Count Wratiflaus has obtained Leave to go to Bohemia, from whence, after a short Stay, he will proceed to the Court of Vienna and return hither towards the latter End of November. Hague, Sept. 25, N. S. M. Grevenbroek, the Elector Palatine's Minister at the Court

Hague, Sept. 25, N. S. M. Grevenbroek, the Elector Palatine's Minister at the Court of France, arrived here fome Days ago from Manheim on his Return to his Post. The Pretext that this Minister gives out for taking this Place in his Way, and staying here, as he defigns, a short Time, is to see the Country; but it is supposed he has Orders to found the Intentions of People here, or to intimate those of his Court upon the Affair of Bergues and Juliers. M. Van Hoey left Paris on the 13th Instant, and arrived here the 17th. The Prince of Orange, with the Princess Royal his Confort, are expected here To-morrow Night : Part of their Court and Retinue being already arrived.

Zelle, where his Majefty defigns to take the Plealure of hunting Wild Boars that Day and the next, and to continue his Journey on Wednesday for the Gohrde. And on Tuef-Wednefday for the Gohrde. day the 25th his Excellency Horatio Walpole, Elq; his Majesty's Ambasladour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the States General; who is now attending his Majesty in this Country, proposes to set out from Hanover for the Gohrde.
