PROCLAMATION. A

For discovering, apprehending, and bringing to fusice the Persons concerned in the bar-barous Murder of Captain John Porteous, and the wicked, violent, and audacious Outrages committed at Edinburgh on the Seventh Day of this Instant September.

CAROLINE R. C. R.

HEREAS it hath been reprefented unto us, that on the Se-venth Day of this Inftant Sep-

tember, a great Number of wick-ed, diffolute, and diforderly Perfons, did, in a most tumultuous, riotous, and outragious Manner, and in open Breach and Violation of the Peace, and in Contempt and Defiance of the Laws of this Realm, affemble and convene themfelves together in the City of Edinburgh, and feize the Arms of the Guard of the faid City, and drive them from the Guard Room, where they had been posted for the Safety and Security of the faid City, and did by Force posses themselves of the Gates thereof, and did likewife break open the Talbooth, or Prifon of the faid City, by fetting Fire to the Gates thereof, and thereby fet at large the feveral Prisoners therein confined for divers Crimes, and did thereout, in a most cruel Manner, drag John Porteous, commonly called Captain John Porteous, there also confined under a Judgment and Sentence of Death, the Execution whereof had been by a Reprieve granted by us respited, and did most barbarously and inhumanly Murder the faid John Porteous, by hanging him up by the Neck until he was dead, without any legal Warrant or Authority for fo doing : And whereas it is highly neceffary that the Perfons concerned in fuch unparalleled Cruelties and Violences should not escape without fpeedy and exemplary Punifhment; We therefore, being moved with a just Indigna-tion and Abhorrence of fuch outragious and detestable Practices, and to deter all others from -committing the like for the future, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of his Majefty's Privy Council, to iffue this Pro-clamation, and We do hereby ftrictly charge and command all Magistrates and other civil Officers what foever, and all other his Majefty's Subjects, that they do make frict and diligent Search and Inquiry after the Perfons concerned in the faid barbarous Murder, Tumult, and Riot, and the Authors, Actors, and Abettors thereof, and that they do apprehend and feize, or caufe to be apprehended or feized, the faid Offenders, that they may be punished with the utmost Rigour of the Law; and We do hereby firictly charge and command all his Majesty's loving Subjects, that they do use their utmost Endeavours to discover and ap-

couragement of all Perfons to be diligent and industrious in their Endeavours to make such Difcovery, and for the better and more effectual bringing the Offenders to Justice, and to prevent fuch wicked, deteftable, and abominable Practices for the future, We do here-by promife and declare, That if any Perfon or Perfons, concerned in any of the Offences before mentioned, shall, before the Twentieth Day of November next, difcover any other, Perfon or Perfons, who hath, or have been guilty of any of the faid Offences, fo as the Perfon or Perfons fo difcovered may be apprehended and convicted of the faid Offences, fuch Difcoverer or Difcoverers shall have his Majesty's most gracious Pardon ; and as a fur-ther Encouragement to the Discovery of the faid Offenders, We do hereby promise and declare, that any Person or Persons, who shall, before the faid Twentieth Day of November, difcover and apprehend, or caufe to be difco-vered and apprehended, any of the Perfons concerned in the faid heinous Offences, fo as he, the, or they may be convicted thereof, fhall have and receive for every Perfon fo dif-covered, apprehended, and convicted, the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds Sterling; which faid Sum of 'Two Hundred Pounds Sterling, for every fuch Offender fo difcovered and convicted, the Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, or the Lord High Treasurer of Great Britain for the Time being, are hereby directed to pay accordingly, without any further or other Warrant in that Behalf : And Laftly, We do hereby ftrictly charge and command all his Majefty's loving Subjects, that they do use their utmost Diligence and Endeavours, in their feveral Places and Stations, to find out, discover, and apprehend all fuch Offenders, as aforelaid, upon Pain of his Majesty's highest Displeasure.

Given at the Court at Kensington the Twenty third Day of September, 1736. in the Tenth Year of his Majesty's Reign. GOD Save the King.
