Petersbourg, September 5.

ORDERS are signed by the Czarina for raising 60,000 Recruits, 12 Men are to be added to every Troop of Horse and Company of Foot, which will make about 10,000, and the remaining 50,000 are to recruit the Army; for it is not said any new Regiments are to be raised. Orders are likewise given to buy 40,000 Horses for the Army.

Dresden, Sept. 26, N. S. M. Thulemeyer, one of his Prussian Majesty's Ministers of his Cabinet Council, and who has a chief Hand in the Dispatch of Affairs at the Court of Berlin, came hither some Days ago, in his Return from Toplitz in Bohemia, where he had been for the Recovery of his Health, and it was supposed, upon his Arrival at this Place, that he was charged by the King his Master with the Delivery of his Letter of Recognition to King Augustus, but the said Minister is gone from hence, without having mentioned the least Word about it. The Palatin of Kiovia has written to this Court, that the Tartar Inhabitants of the Frontiers of Walachia, and Subjects of the Ottoman Porte, had made two Incurfions into Podlachia, and carried off some Hundreds of Peasants into Slavery. The Bishop of Pofnania is arrived here from Poland.

Dresden, Oct. 3, N. S. This Court went on the 9th past from Hubertsburg to Leipzig, but will return again to Hubertsburg in a few Days, to celebrate the Birth of his Polish Majesty, when the King designs to establish a Military Order, the Badge of which will consist of a Cross with 8 Points, having on one Side the Picture of St. Henry, and on the other the Words *Pietate & Fortitudine*, hanging to a Purple coloured Ribband on the Breast. His Majesty has ordered a certain Revenue to be set apart for the Support of this Order, and 'tis said that each Knight will be allow'd a Pension of 300 Crowns per Annum. The Number to be made at present is not to exceed 20. By Letters from Poland we have Advice; that the Tartars have been a third Time in the Palatinate of Podlachia; but that their General, with whom the Palatin of Kiovia had had a Conference, disowned all those People, and said he should be glad if they were taken and treated as Robbers.

Berlin, Oct. 2, N. S. M. Thulemeyer is returned hither from the Baths of Toplitz. Baron Brackel the Russian Minister at this Court, received Letters Yesterday from Petersburg which brought him Advice, that Felt Marshal Munich had, with the principal Part of his Army, drawn near the Dnieper. That he had not however abandoned the Lines of Perecop, having left there a sufficient Force to defend them, and at the same Time erected Redoubts at certain Distances between them and his Camp, not only to prevent any Surprise, but also to secure a free Communication between the Forces he had left in the said Lines and his Camp. These Letters add, that the Grand Vizier with his Army lyes encamped on the other Side of the Dnieper.
