WE hear, that a Ship of *Dantzick*, called the *Half Moon*, of 350 Tuns, laden with Salt, Wine, and Brandy, struck upon the *Edge-Stone* Sunday night last, and sunk immediately downright, but all her Men saved in their Boat.

Newcastle, Feb. 7. We hear, there are several Privateers upon this Coast, but they are like to get no great matter, our Loaden Vessels going in Fleets, and well secured by Convoys. A small Vessel venturing alone, and going into *Sunderland*, was like to have fallen into the hands of one of them, but the people on shoar Manned out a Boat, and happily rescued her.

Harwich, Feb. 8. Our Packet-Boat came in this day from the *Briel*, and confirms, that the *Caper* which took the *Constantinople Merchant*, is since sunk; and that a small Frigate continuing two or three days, had put them in great apprehensions of some attempt from the French.
