AT the Court at *Kensington*, the Thirteenth Day of *October* 1736.

P R E S E N T,

The Queen's most Excellent Majesty, Guardian of the Kingdom of Great Britain, and his Majesty's Lieutenant within the same, in Council.

Her Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, that the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the Fourteenth of this Instant *October*, should be further prorogued to Thursday the Twenty Fifth Day of *November* next.

Petersbourg, Sept. 18. It is reported here as certain, that Felt Marshal Count Munich is arrived at *Czariczenka*, and that his Troops were so harrassed in their Journey by the *Crim* and *Nogay* Tartars, that he was forced to march them almost all the Way in Square Battalions, the Fatigue whereof, together with Sickneſs and other Accidents, is laid to have greatly reduced their Number. It is likewise reported, that General *Leontoff* has lost a great many of the Troops under his Command in retiring from *Kinburn*, the Tartars having closely pursued him till he joined the main Army. Some affirm that the Tartars have advanced even to the Borders of the *Ukraine*, and burnt some Villages near *Bah nur*. This Court have learnt, that the Russian Officer who carried the *Czarina's* Answer to the Grand *Vizier's* Letter, was passed through *Choczim* in his Way to the *Vizier's* Camp; and it is supposed, if he is not long detained there, he may return hither with the said *Vizier's* Answer in about three Weeks. The only Daughter of the late Prince *Menzikoff*, who was married to General Adjutant *Biron*, the Great Chamberlain's Brother, died here some Days ago, and was buried Yesterday.

Turin, Oct. 10, N. S. We have not the least News of the Imperialists in the *Milaneſe*. By the few Letters that come from thence we are informed, that they are entirely taken up with new modelling the Government of that State, and the rest of *Lombardy*. Count *Traun*, who is to command as General the whole Army, is not yet arrived, but is daily expected. Some private Letters mention, that in the mean while, Count *Kevenhuller* had ordered that all the Cannons, Carriages, Mortars, Bomb-shells, Balls, Ammunition, and Magazines that were deposited in *Pavia*, should be removed to *Mantua*, which last the Emperor intends shall be the general Store for the Defence of the State of *Milan*, having found by Experience, that *Pavia*, in itself, being a bad Place, and of little Defence, all Stores deposited there must immediately fall into the Hands of the first Invader, and be turned against them, as happened in the Beginning of the late War, when it would have been very difficult, if not impossible, for the Allies to have carried on, in so advanced a Season of the Year, the Sieges

of *Pizzighitone* and the Castle of *Milan*, without the Stores they found in *Pavia*. The Letters from *Venice* mention; that General *Stampa* was arrived there on the 20th past from *Vienna*, with Instructions from his Court for the Government of the *Mantuan*; that he had likewise a Commission to confer with Count *Fuenclara*, the Spanish Ambassador at *Venice*, on the Evacuation of *Tuscany*; and the exchanging the Acts of Cession; and that he was at the same time to deliver to him the Emperor's Passports for his Journey to *Vienna*, where he is to reside as the Catholicick King's Minister, as soon as the Spanish Troops have evacuated.

Copenhagen, Oct. 13, N. S. *M. Vitzleben*, who was Land-droft of *Delmenhorst*, being removed to the like Post in *Oldenburg*, vacant by the Death of *M. Scheffed*, Count *Reufs* is appointed Land-droft of *Delmenhorst* in his stead. This young Gentleman came but a few Years ago into this Kingdom, in Company with Count *Ifenburg* and Count *Lynar*; and in a short Time attained a Golden Key; with a Place in the Chancery. All the Royal Family continue in perfect Health. *M. Lamb* the Physician, who has recovered the King of *Denmark*, by venturing, against the Opinion of several others, to administer the "ark to him, has also advised his Majesty to use Exercise, and to endeavour with Amusements and Diversions to keep his Mind always chearful; and agreeable to this Prescription, his Danish Majesty rides out almost every Day, and diverts himself with Shooting.

Berlin, Oct. 13, N. S. We hear that Felt Marshal Munich, with the Army under his Command, has left *Kinburn* and is returned to his first Camp at *Czariczenka*, and this being confirmed here, leaves no room to doubt but the *Muscovites* have entirely abandoned the *Crimea*, and raised the Lines and Fortifications of *Perecop*. Some Letters lately received here, advise, that Felt Marshal Munich has Orders to repair forthwith to *Petersbourg*. *M. Pretorius*, the Danish Minister at this Court, received a few Days ago, his Letters of Revocation.
