**M.** Keyfeiling, her Czarish Majesty's Minister at this Court, has presented a second Memorial, upon the Subject of the continual Incurfions made by the Tartars into Poland, and enforces the Necessity of his Polish Majesty's taking speedily proper Measures to hinder such Practices for the future. Count Sulkowski, who went from hence on the 10th Instant to Lissa, returned hither again this Day. Count Lynar, the Polish Minister to the Court of Petersbourg, who is now returned hither with his Polish Majesty's Leave, reports, that the Russians think there is the strictest Friendship subsisting between the Persians and them, and that the News which had been spread of a Peace being concluded between the Grand Signior and the Sophy of Persia, was entirely without Foundation. M. de Lofs, his Polish Majesty's Minister to the Court of Great Britain, arrived here a few Days ago from Hanover.

*Copenhagen, Oct. 27, N. S.* The 19th Instant, being the Birth-day of the Princess Louisa, the same was celebrated at Friedensburg in plain Habits, according to the Ordonnance of the 16th of April last, to restrain Luxury in Apparel. This Princess, who is Daughter to their present Danish Majesties, enters now into the Eleventh Year of her Age. The King of Denmark went lately to survey the Building of his new Palace, which has already occasioned a vast Expence, and is now advanced to the third Story. The Danish Court came Yesterday to Fridericksberg, a Town in this Neighbourhood, where it is supposed they will pass the Winter.

*Hague, Nov. 2, N. S.* The States of the Province of Holland will assemble on the 14th Instant; and it is hoped the Grand Pensionary may then be able to assist in their Deliberations. M. St. Gil, the Spanish Ambassador here, says publicly, that the Affairs which have been some Time depending between his Master and the Court of Vienna, are now entirely adjusted, and that in Consequence thereof, Tuscany will be immediately evacuated by the Spaniards. The said Ambassador is making Preparations for giving a splendid Entertainment on Sunday next, to a great Number of Persons whom he has invited, in order to celebrate the Birth-Day of Don Carlos.

*Kensington, October 21.*

M. Johnn, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark, had this Day his first private Audience of her Majesty; to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Harrington one of his Majesty's principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by John Inglis, Esq; Assistant Master of the Ceremonies.

*Kensington, Oct. 25.* This Day M. Johnn, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark, had his first private Audience of his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales.

He had afterwards an Audience of her Royal Highness the Princess of Wales; to both which Audiences he was conducted by the Assistant Master of the Ceremonies.
