Berlin, November 6.

LAST Saturday being the Feast of St. Hubert, it was celebrated at Wuffterhaufen by General Gromkow, who gave a grand Entertainment to the King of Prussia his Master on that Occasion. Since the last Account received here of the Retreat of the Muscovites from the Crimea, we have had nothing material concerning Affairs in those Quarters.

Hambourg, Nov. 7, N. S. Mr. Finch, his Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the King of Sweden, arrived here Yesterday from Hanover in his Way to Stockholm.

Dresden, Nov. 7, N. S. This Court seems very uneasy about the Irruptions the Tartars have made into Poland; and the King has wrote to the Palatin of Kiovia, to endeavour to secure those Frontiers from the like Invasions for the future; and some Polish Troops have been ordered to march for that purpose into the Palatinates of Brollavia and Podolia.

Her Majesty has been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal of his Majesty's Kingdom of Ireland, constituting James Wall and Charles-William Wall, Esqrs. Searcher, Gauger, and Packer in the Ports of his Majesty's City of Waterford and New Ross.

Whereas George Kelly, a Prisoner in the Tower of London, made his Escape from thence Yesterday, as is supposed between the Hours of Seven and Eight in the Evening: Her Majesty is graciously pleased to promise a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any Person or Persons that shall apprehend and seize, or cause to be apprehended and seized, the said George Kelly, so that he may be secured, and proceeded against according to Law.

The said George Kelly is aged about Forty Eight Years, Five Foot Ten Inches high, or thereabouts, a little too slender leg'd for his Height, of a fair Complexion, good Teeth, large blue Eyes, and a broad and flattish Face, inclining to be slender rather than fat, his Hair is very greyish, and the Fore-part of his Head, so near the Middle of it, is very bald.
