GOD Save the King.

Hague, Dec. 25, N. S. His Britannick Majesty arrived at Helvoetfluys, in good Health, on Friday last the 21st Instant, at Eight a-Clock at Night. His Majesty is detained there by contrary Winds. In the mean while his Majesty sends every Day hither to know how the Princess of Orange does: Her Royal Highness continues in a very fair Way. The Child of which she was delivered, was carried on Saturday last to Delft, and deposited in the Vault belonging to the Princes of Orange.

And as a farther Encouragement, her Majesty is also pleased to promise a Reward of Fifty Pounds for every one of the Criminals who shall be discovered and apprehended as aforesaid; to be paid upon the Conviction of the Offender or Offenders.
