THE Winds continuing contrary for the King's Voyage to England, his Majesty still remains at Helvoetsluys, from which Place we have the Pleasure of hearing that his Majesty enjoys perfect Health. Her Royal Highness the Princess of Orange has, since her late Lying-in, continued to recover daily her Health and Strength, which at present are looked upon to be perfectly established. The States of Holland are expected here this Day, in order to meet To-morrow upon their Domestick Affairs.

Helvoetsluys, Jan. 11, N. S. The Louisa Man of War, one of the King's Convoy, which after putting to Sea in Company with his Majesty's Yachts, had got to the Downs, and was afterwards ordered back by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to join Sir Charles Wager, happened on the 29th past, O. S. to strike on a Sand at the Hinder, not far from the Goree, by which Accident the Ship was lost, but all the Men belonging to her (except 17) were saved. The Hulk now stands on Shore, but it is believed will be soon beat to Pieces by the Waves. The Lime Man of War is come back hither safe from Harwich; and we are told that the Alborough, which is in the Downs, will return hither likewise.
