E have now certain Advice, that Count Lynard, the Saxon Minifter, is not to return again to this Court. Orders were fent two Days ago to M. Keyferling, the Czarina's Minifter at Dreiden, to return hither immediately, her Czarifh Majefty being defirous to have from him by Word of Mouth, an Account of feveral Things that paffed during the Time of his being employed at the Court of Poland. The 7th being the Birth-day of the Princefs of Mecklenbourg, who then entered into the Eighteenth Year of her Age, and the 9th being her Name-day, the fame were obferved here with the greateft Demonftrations of Joy. All the foreign Minifters and Perfons of Diffinction went in the Morning to compliment her Czarian Majefty and the Princefs on that Occafion, and at Night there was a Ball and Supper at Court. latin of Kiovia, who was on the Frontiers to have an Eye that the Polifh Troops placed there to obferve the Motions of the Tartars committed no Diforders on the Turkifh Territories. M. de Loos, his Polifh Majefty's Minifter to the Court of Great Britain, who had the King's Permiffion to come hither from Hanover to pay his Duty to his Majefty, having received his Orders and Inftructions, will forthwith be fetting out for England, whither he intends to go by the Way of Calais. The Ruffian Minifter, Baron Keyferling, received Yefterday an Express from his Court, with Leave to return to Petersburg; on which Account he had afterwards a private Audience of his Polifh Majefty. He propoles fetting out from hence in four or five Days, and to be ablent but a fhort Time. Late laft Night Thomas Robinfon, Efq; his Britannick Majefty's Minifter Plenipotentiary to the Court of Vienna, arrived here; where he intends to ftay a few Days, and then proceed on his Journey to England.
