M. Ozarowski, who was sent Minister from King Stanislaus to the Court of France immediately after he was elected King of Poland, is arrived here, and has been very well received. M. Donski, one of the Commissioners for the selling of King Stanislaus's Estates in Poland, is set out from this Place for France, to make Report of what has passed hitherto in the Execution of the said Commission. The latest Accounts from the Palatinates of Cracow, Sandomir, and Siradia, as likewise from Great Poland, mention the great Scarcity of Corn which augments daily. The Peasants in great Numbers retire into Silesia, where the Scarcity likewise increases; and the King of Prussia has ordered that they should not be received in his Country.

Copenhagen, Feb. 2, N. S. The last Storm has blown down the high Spire of the Church of St. Nicholas at Elsenore, which was a very useful Sea Mark, both for guiding Ships into the Sound, and for directing them by its bearing with other Points, when to let fall their Topails in Honour of the Fortrefs of Cronenburg. Major General Pretorius is returned from Berlin, and was received in a gracious Manner by the King of Denmark.

Berlin, Feb. 9, N. S. M. Brackel having received no Answer to his Memorial, by which he claimed the Russian Subjects in the Prussian Troops, he renewed those Instances a few Days ago, and insisted, by order of his Court, on his Prussian Majesty's explaining himself upon that Demand of the Czarina his Mistress. We have had an Account here, that on the 23d of last Month died at his Episcopal See the Bishop of Augsbουργ, younger Brother to the Elector Palatine. This Incident has not yet produced any new Resolutions of this Court, with respect to the Succession of Bergues and Juliers; but it is probable it will accelerate the Measures that are taking on that Affair.

Hague, Feb. 15, N. S. The States of Holland have been assembled these three Days, and have under Consideration the Military Estimates and Establishments for the current Year; and also the Differences between the Towns of Dort and Gorcom, upon the Project formed some Time ago for increasing the Waters of the Maese in the Neighbourhood of Dort. As to the Choice of their Pensionary, and the filling up of other vacant Employments, they seem resolved to keep them in Reserve till their ordinary Meeting next Month. The last Advices from the Rhine, are, that the French are actually evacuating the Places they are to restore.
