Ozarowski, who was fent Minifter from King Staniflaus to the Court of France immediately after he was elected King of Poland, is arrived here, and has been very well received. M. Domski, one of the Com-miffioners for the felling of King Staniflaus's Effates in Poland, is fet out from this Place for France, to make Report of what has paffed hitherto in the Execution of the faid Commiffion. The lateft Accounts from the Palatinates of Cracow, Sendomir, and Siradia, as likewife from Great Poland, mention the great Scarcity of Corn which augments daily. The Peafants in great Numbers retire into Si-lefia, where the Scarcity likewife increafes; and the King of Pruffia has ordered that they

fhould not be received in his Gountry. Copenhagen, Feb. 2, N. S. The laftStorm has blown down the high Spire of the Church of St. Nicholas at Elfenore, which was a very useful Sea Mark, both for guiding Ships into the Sound, and for directing them by its bearing with other Points, when to let fall their Topfails in Honour of the Fortress of Cronenburg. Major General Pretorius is returned from Berlin, and was received in a

gracious Manner by the King of Denmark. Berlin, Feb. 9, N. S. M. Brackel having received no Answer to his Memorial, by which he claimed the Ruffian Subjects in the Pruffian Troops, he renewed those Instances a few Days ago, and inlisted, by order of his Court, on his Pruffian Majefty's explaining himfelf spon that Demand of the Czarina his Miftrefs. We have had an Account here, that on the 23d of last Month died at his Episcopal See the Bishop of Augsbourg, younger Brother to the Elector Palatine. This Incident has not yet produced any new Refolutions of this Court, with respect to the Succession of Bergues and Juliers; but it is probable it will accelerate the Measures that are taking on that Affair.

Hague, Feb. 15, N. S.
