Vienna, February 6, N. S.

Courier arrived on the 1ft Inflant from Prince Pio at Venice, with Advice, that he the Emperor's Ambaffadour having had at laft an Account of the Imperial Troops having actually taken Polletion of Tufcany, had thought proper to deliver on the 17th paft, N.S. the Emperor's Paflport to Count Fuenclara, the Spanith Ambaffadour to this Court, who is now expected here on the 14th or 15th Inflant. Yefterday Morning at Ten of the Clock the Dutchefs of Lorrain was brought to Bed of a Princefs, who was baptized the fame Evening at Six of the Clock in the Duke of Lorrain's fecond Antichamber. The Pope's Nuncio performed the Ceremony. The Emperor ftood Godfather, the Godmothers were the two Emprefles, and the youngeft Archdutchefs in the Name of the Dutchefs Dowager of Lorrain.

Drefden, Feb. 13, N. S. Count Kevenhuller, the Imperial Minister late at the Court of Denmark, passed through this Place on Friday last on his Way for Vienna. By Letters from the Ukraine we are informed, that Count Munich, before his Departure from Kioff, gave Assuring to the Great General of Poland, that the Czarina would observe the Neutrality with regard to Poland during the War with the Turks. We have News from Vienna, that the Turks are now dispofed to treat of Peace, and that they have named Deputies for that Purpose.

med Deputies for that Purpofe. Hague, Feb. 19, N. S. We hear that Count Uhlfeldt left Vienna the i2th Inflant to return hither by the Way of Bruffels. The States of Holland continue their Affembly; but there is no Appearance that any Thing will be done as to the Dilpofal of the vacant Places, till their ordinary Affembly of next Month. We have an Account here from Conftantinople, that the Turks have confented to a Congress upon their Frontiers, and named already their Plenipotentiaries.
