Petersbourg, January 22. HIS Court continues to make very great Preparations, in order to have a numerous Army in the Field early in the Spring : A Battallion of 700 Men of each of the three Regiments of Foot Guards are ordered to march; as they are very good Troops, those 2100 Men will make a fine Appearance in the Field. About 4000 Seamen, with a Rear Admiral, nine Captains, a great Number of Lieutenants and Malters, have been fent from hence, with Anchors, Gables, and all Sorts of Stores for Shipping, to Tabaroff on the River Don, and to Branska on the Nieper; among the Officers there are five English Captains, and a great many English Lieutenants ; they are to command the Boats that are built at Tabaroff and Branska. Laft Wednefday being the Anniverfary of her Czarish Majesty's Accession to the Throne, all the Foreign Ministers and Russian Nobility were invited to dine at Court; at Night there was a fine Illumination, and a Ball, as usual, at the Palace.

St. James's, February 17. This Day M. Bully, fent from the King of France, had a private Audience of his Majesty; to which he was introduc'd by his Grace the Duke of Newcaftle, one of his Majefly's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Mafter of the Ceremonies.

He had afterwards a private Audience of the Queen; to which he was introduc'd by the Right Honourable the Earl of Grantham, her Majesty's Lord Chamberlain, and con-ducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.

St. James's, February 18. This Day M. Buffy, had a private Au-dience of his Royal Highnels the Prince of Wales.

And afterwards a private Audience of her Royal Highness the Princess of Wales; to both which he was introduc'd by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.
