THE 23d Instant Feldt Marshal Munich set out from hence in order to go to Gloukoff in the Ukraine, where Feldt Marshal Lacy is to meet him, to concert, as it is supposed, Measures for the next Campaign. Before Count Munich left this Place, the Czarina was pleased to give him several Estates in Livonia and in the Ukraine, amounting to the yearly Value of above 6000 Roubles. The three Battalions of the Foot Guards are on their March to join the Army, and a Body of about 3 or 400 Men of the Horse Guards are to follow them in a very few Days. The Prince of Bevern having asked Leave of her Czarish Majesty to serve this Campaign under Feldt Marshal Munich, he is to set out in two or three Weeks: his Horses and Part of his Equipage are to go from hence To-morrow. It is not yet known whether the Prince of Bevern is to have Command, or to serve as a Volontier. His Regiment of Cuirassiers, as well as that of Feldt Marshal Munich, which were in Courland, are also marched to join the Army in the Ukraine, which it is assured will consist of 100,000 regular Troops, besides a vast Number of Cossacks and Calmucks. Yesterday being her Czarish Majesty's Birth-day, all the Foreign Ministers and Russian Nobility appeared at Court in magnificent Cloaths. All the Foreign Ministers and other Persons of Distinction were invited to dine at Court, and at Night there was a Ball.

Vienna, Feb. 16, N. S. M. du Theil, the French Minister at this Court, received on Wednesday last in the Evening, the original Act of Cession of the Dutchy of Lorraine, which he sent to his Court by a Courier on Thursday last at Night.

Hague, March 1, N. S. The States having passed a new Resolution upon the Affair of Bergues and Juliers, it was communicated Yesterday to the Imperial and French Ministers, and to Mr. Trevor. The Marquess de Fenelon having received Leave from his Court to repair to Paris, he is taking Leave to Day of the chief Persons in the Administration of this State, in order to set out To-morrow or next Day. Yesterday M. Ginkel set out for Berlin. We have Advice, that the Emperour's Minister Count Uhlesfeld is arrived from Vienna at Brussels, in order to return hither.
