Vienna, February 27, N. S.

COUNT Perouse, the new Bavarian Envoy, arrived here the 25th Instant. An Imperial Courier returned hither on Sunday last from Petersbourg, with Advice of Felt Marshal Munich's having left Petersbourg on the 3d Instant, in order to go to the Muscovite Army and hasten the Preparations against the Turks; and with fresh instances from the Czarina to this Court, to concert proper Measures, and act in Conjunction with her on this Occasion.

Dresden, March 6, N. S. This Court has at last confiscated the Estates of the late Count de Hoim, on Account of the Crimes alledged against him. The Baron de Zech, his Polish Majesty's Minister at the Court of Vienna, having obtained Leave to return Home, is expected here in a few Days; it is thought he will have some Domestic Employment given him, and that another Minister will be sent to the Imperial Court in his stead.

Hague, March 19, N. S. The ordinary Assembly of the States of Holland opened on the 13th Instant. On the 15th, the Custody of the Great Seal of this Province, being the first Thing to be disposed of, was given to the Count d'Obdam, in the Room of the late M. Boetselaer; M. Vander Heim is raised to the important Post of Grand Pensionary for Holland, in the Room of the late M. Slingelandt; M. Charles Wassenar to that of Grand Bailly of the Hague, and Count Hompesch is made Grand Forester of Holland, both which Places were held by the said late M. Boetselaer; and M. Vander Duyn has succeeded M. Wassenar in the Command he had of the Foot Guards.
