IS Majefty came this Day to the Houfe of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, SirCharles Dalton, Gentleman-Usher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meflage from His Majefty to the Houle of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Affent to,

An Ast for punifying Mutiny and Defer-tion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

Petersbourg, Feb. 26. Madrid, March 18. On Tuesday the 12th Instant Benjamin Keene, Esq; his Britannick Majefty's Minister Plenipotentiary, gave an Entertainment at Fuencaral, a Vil-lage between this Town and the Pardo, in Celebration of her Britannick Majefty's Birthday. The Infante Don Phelipe is appointed by his Catholick Majefty Grand Admiral of

Spain, and of all its Maritime Forces; and the Duke de Montemar is named Minister of War, which Employment has been vacant fince the Death of the late M. Patinho.

Vienna, March 18. We are assured that Count Fuenclara, the Sicilian Minister here, has demanded the fecond Archdutchess for Don Carlos, and that he has made this De-mand in feparate and formal Vilits laft Week to all the Imperial Ministers. Count Sinzendorff has himfelf told it plainly to Count Tarouca : And Count Fuenclara is faid to have accompanied that Demand with very advantageous Offers. Count Pletten-berg, who was upon the Point of fetting out

from hence for his Embaffy at Rome, died laft Night after an Illneis of Eight Days. *Hague, March* 29, N. S.
